



Some 400 young people had gone through the ranks of the Kiddies' Choir when Dr. Schultz founded the Schubert Choir in 1938. For a number of years the choir consisted of girls only, but by 1949, when *The Gondoliers* was the production, boys and men had joined the ranks. Leads included, L to R, Joe Ross, Roberta (Wilkie) Rose, and Glen Milliken, who would himself direct some of the final musical productions of the choir.

Year after year for almost two decades, the city hall opera house would ring to the strains of Gilbert and Sullivan, Sigmund Romberg, and Victor Herbert, and night after night, full houses would applaud the lavish productions.

In April of 1974, former choir members returned to Brandon from across Canada and the United States to honour Dr. and Mrs. Schultz, shown seated in the centre of the front row of the reunion photograph taken in the ballroom of the Canadian Inn.
