

Norman James - born at Lauder May 20, 1905, married Gertrude Thelma Duthie October 26, 1932 (see Duthie history page 372). They farmed on 29-5-24 and rented Thelma's farm W28 to Charlie Molison. About 1944 they traded farms and the Ramseys moved to W28 where Norman died April 17, 1961. Thelma still lives on the farm. They had three children -

James Allan - born January 9, 1938, died February 9, 1938.

Lorna Mae - born October 20, 1933, married Leonard James Gardner November 2, 1952. (Continued with the Sutton-Gardner history page 397.) To update - their daughter Catherine May married Larry James Townsend of Melita December 21, 1974.

Leslie Eldon - born August 27, 1943, farms on the home farm.

Henry (Harry) - born January 26, 1857 in County Antrim, married Catherine Campbell at Dunkell, Ontario in 1880. She was born at Hibbard, Ontario about 1862. They moved to Winnipeg in 1883, to Port Arthur some time later and to Lauder at least as early as 1892 to NE16-5-24. In 1893 or 94 Harry had the livery stable on lots 6 and 7 block 1 and in April 1894 he took over the Commercial Hotel in Hartney but remained there only until February 1895. He bought the store and bakery business on lot 4 block 2 in April 1909 and operated it until about 1911. It is not known what they did after that but they spent their last years in Napinka. Harry died November 28, 1941 and Catherine died January 6, 1940. Both are buried at Napinka. There were at least four children -

Hazel - born about 1893, married James Andrew Gourlay in January 1912. (Continued with the Gourlay history page 377.)

Mabel - married John W. Elsey November 17, 1909. (Continued with the Elsey history page 373.)

Margaret - married Joseph Thompson. She died in Winnipeg October 6, 1972 and is buried at Napinka.

Harold - about the same age group, went to school in Lauder at the same time as the other children and may have been a son of Harry.

Charles - was living at Hinton, Alberta in 1940 and at Jasper in 1941.

Sarah Jane - born November 30, 1861, was married perhaps in Ontario to Henry Charles Hamelin. (Continued with the Hamelin history this volume.)

Charles T. - born March 2, 1864, came west at least as early as 1892. He had the livery stable on lots 6 and 6 block 1 and five horses in 1892. In 1893 he had eight horses and in 1897 he married Maggie Curran. He farmed somewhere near Lauder, sold out in the fall of 1906 and went to Saskatoon district in the spring of 1907. Maggie died sometime around 1902 and Charlie married Mary or Minnie Peacock June 30, 1903. They apparently spent some time in Victoria and came back to Lauder in 1929 with two sons to farm on the Leslie farm, 13-5-25. No more is known of what he did or where he went. He died in February 1947. One report said there were four children in the first marriage and three in the second. The following are from the second marriage:-
