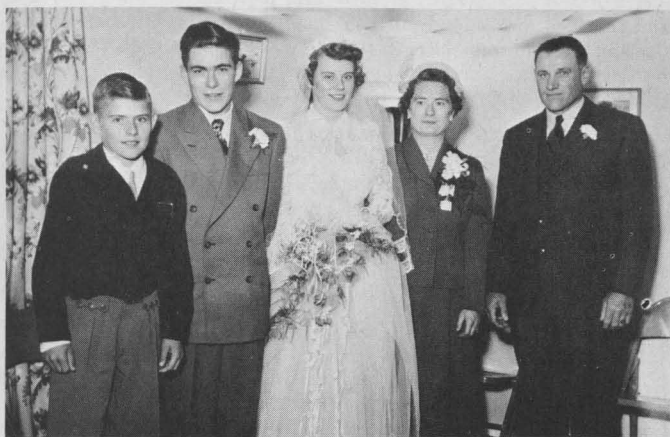


MR. AND MRS. GEORGE ROBERTSON
