



Accommodation: Places to Stay

On September 17, 1928 the paper carried a glowing report of the soon to be opened Hotel Cambrian, located on the corner of Edwards Avenue and Third Street.

‘The new hotel with its 68 guest rooms, spacious corridors and large airy rotunda is a credit to The Pas and places this town on a par, as far as hotel accommodation goes, with many large centres’.

The four storey building measured 64 X 132 feet and cost in the order of \$125,000. All the rooms had hot and cold water, first floor rooms were laid out so they could be used as suites if necessary. Connected bathrooms were a feature of many rooms and ample bathroom accommodation was provided for the others. A restaurant was to be operated in connection with the hotel, which would be run on the American plan.
