Their son, Clarence, was accidentally killed while in the air force. Nellie is still at home with her parents and Jim, who married Glenda Stewart, lives in the same yard as his parents and operates the farm with his father. Jim and Glenda have two children, Sheri and Kevin. Larry married Linda Degleman. They are farming on 11-4-7 in the Opawaka district. They have two children, Ricky and Kelly.
