THE AUTHORITIES have issued notice that the provisions of the following Order-in-Council will be strictly enforced: In the Province of Manitoba and all Northwest territories, whitefish shall not be fished for, caught or killed between the 20th day of October and the 1st day of November; provided, that Indians may catch or kill the same for their own use only, but not for purposes of sale or traffic. Whitefish shall not be taken or used, bought, sold, or possessed, for making oil or feeding domestic animals. Speckled trout shall not be fished for, caught or killed between the 1st day of October and the 1st day of January; provided that Indians may catch or kill the same for their own use only, and not for purposes of sale or traffic. Poor Lo Indians, will probably pay about as much attention to this ordinance as he does on the average to the ten commandments.
